Hiking & Cultural experiences in Italy and Spain

Dear friends,

I am excited to share my 2026 tours with you but **first** let me tell you about 2025.

The [Foot of the Dolomites](#), my **hiking tour in the Italian Alps**, has concluded its **fourth successful year**. Almost 30 people joined the four trips I run in my homeland. In 2026, I will offer **three additional scheduled trips**: in **late August**, **early September** and **early October**. You can also arrange for a private trip and adjust the itinerary and duration for your group.

I launched a new Camino tour this year, the [Camino A Orixe](#), with two private groups in mid-June and mid-July. This Camino is still relatively unknown, and I see far fewer pilgrims along this route. My tour groups felt that the beauty of the landscapes, the quality of the trails, the cultural offerings, the accommodations, and the food were all superb. For this reason, **in 2026 I will offer three scheduled trips**, plus customized trips for private groups.

I finished this season with a **Coastal Portuguese Camino** tour for a private group. Their positive experience confirmed my intention to continue offering this tour for **private groups**; however, I will also offer a **Best of the Portuguese Camino** (coastal and inland) with **scheduled trips**.

Last but not least, I am very excited to announce I've scheduled a **brand new hiking tour in eastern Andalusia** in **mid-March**. I was inspired to design this trip by my experience in the area in 2009 to 2011 when, I was an urban planner overseeing the development of the Territorial Masterplan.

This is an **undiscovered corner of Andalusia where**, within just a few miles, you can go from the dramatic mountains of [Sierra de los Filabres](#) to the solitary beaches of the [Cabo the Gata Natural Park](#), and then across the unexpected and fascinating [Tabernas Desert](#). (In the 1960's, this desert was one of the main locations for Spaghetti Western films.) I have long wanted to share the beauty of this area, and now I have the opportunity.

Tour Description

The tour starts along the borders of **Valbelluna**—a wide valley carved by the **Piave River** as it flows to the lagoon of Venice. The valley of Valbelluna stretches out between the Alps and the lower (but no less enchanting) **Venetian Pre-Alps**.

The hikes are spread throughout the four main areas of this valley: **Alpago**, **Coi de Pera-Nevegal**, **Valmorel-Feltre**, along with the charming **Prosecco** hills region (recently added as a UNESCO World Heritage site). While **walking** is the focus of this tour, I will season your experience with other enticing ingredients—not just in the excellent food! During the **10-day itinerary** I will show you the unique geography, history, deep-rooted traditions and thriving heritage of the Dolomites.



The daily routine is simple: **hiking in the morning**, time to **rest and relax in the afternoon** and **optional pre-dinner activities** in the early evening. You will find **food** another highlight of this experience. I have designed a culinary journey with carefully chosen restaurants. The menus will highlight regional specialties, sometimes served with a creative twist.



Last (and very important to me), your **accommodations** will balance **simplicity, comfort and authenticity**. Most are cozy rural inns surrounded by green mountains and breathtaking views. This type of accommodation is called an **agriturismo**. They are a combination of lodging and agriculture, and most are family-run working farms. An agriturismo offers **home-cooked food, generous hospitality, and a strong commitment to sustainability**.



This tour includes guided visits to the beautiful towns of **Vittorio Veneto, Belluno** or **Feltre**, with a chance to do a little shopping or just stroll along the historic streets. We also visit a winery in the **Prosecco** region for a tour and tasting.

Itinerary

Here is an outline of the tour. The special events, such as festivals, fairs, and art exhibitions, will change depending on the dates of the trip you choose.



Day 1. Meet in **Conegliano** in the early afternoon. Van ride to **Vittorio Veneto** and hotel check-in. Welcome meeting. Guided tour of **Serravalle**—the medieval section of Vittorio Veneto. Enjoy a spritz cocktail before dinner.

Highlights: Guided tour of Vittorio Veneto, welcome dinner

Day 2. Checkout and van ride to **Cansiglio**. Cansiglio Ring circular hike. Option to visit the ethnographic museum. Dinner at local restaurant serving specialties from the Alps.

Highlights: Grotte del Caglieron

Overnight: Cansiglio/Alpago



Day 3. **Mezzomiglio** circular hike. Special lunch at a malga (alpine farm). Optional visit to the Anthropological Museum of Cansiglio.

Highlights: Views of the Santa Croce Lake, visit to a malga

Overnight: Cansiglio/Alpago



Day 4. Checkout and van ride to Val Salatis. Hike **Val Salatis** to **Pian de le Stéle**. Optional extension to **Rifugio Semenza**. Dinner at the hotel.

Highlights: Walking a section of the Alta Via n. 6 (part of the Dolomites High Route Network), special picnic lunch at Pian de le Stéle

Overnight: Val Salatis or Cansiglio



Day 5. Checkout. Transfer to **Santa Croce Lake** area. Hike by the lake and free time (swimming possible on summer trip). Optional tour of Land Art sculptures by Giorgio Vazza. Van ride to Coi de Pera and check-in. Optional tour of the murals in Coi de Pera. Special dinner.

Highlights: Time at Santa Croce Lake to enjoy the water, optional tour of Land Art, optional mural tour, special dinner

Overnight: Coi de Pera



Day 6. Transfer to Nevegal. Circular hike along **Col Visentin** trail. Evening van ride to Belluno.

Highlights: Reaching the top of the mountain at Col Visentin; breathtaking views of the **Valbelluna** and the **Dolomites**

Overnight: Coi de Pera



Day 7. Checkout. Van ride to **Valmorel**. Malghe circular hike. Time to rest and chill out. Optional afternoon hike to the **Boion waterfall**. Optional visit to the **Native American Cultural museum** in Valmorel.

Highlights: Hiking in the homeland of Dino Buzzati, the author of "The Tartar Steppe"

Overnight: Pranolz



Day 8. Pian de le Fémene hike. Optional visit to the Museo della Resistenza—a tribute to the partisan resistance against the Nazi occupation in WWII.

Highlights: Barbecue picnic, dinner with live music

Overnight: Pranolz



Day 9. Checkout and van ride to **Valdobbiadene**. Hike through the Prosecco valley, Van ride to Cison di Valmarino and check-in. Winery tour, tasting and farewell dinner.

Highlights: Prosecco winery tour and tasting, Cison di Valmarino, sleeping in a castle

Overnight: Cison di Valmarino



Day 10. Checkout. Van ride to **Conegliano** railway station by 11 a.m.

End of tour and Arrivederci!!!

This itinerary may change due to unforeseen circumstances. The safety and comfort of the participants is my absolute priority. Activities such as cooking and language classes, painting workshops, and guided visits to local attractions may be added to the final itinerary without additional costs.

Tour Description

According to tradition, the **Camino A Orixe** (“the origin”) is the route taken to bring the relics of Saint James to the place where they were buried in Galicia. The story goes that after Saint James’s martyrdom, his disciples placed his remains in a stone boat and sailed from Palestine to the northwestern coast of the Iberian Peninsula.

The route of the *Camino A Orixe* begins where the locals met the boat as it came ashore. This ancient path follows the **Ría de Arousa** and the **Ulla River**, which were used to travel inland toward **Padrón**. From there, the journey continued—by a carriage pulled by oxen—to the place where the relics were finally buried. That place would later become the city of Santiago.

Fortunately for us, the beautiful *Camino A Orixe* remains relatively unknown. The route is **135 km** (84 miles), running primarily along the southern coast of the **Barbanza Peninsula**. It connects enchanting beaches and unspoiled natural areas with the villages and small towns scattered along the Ría ([map](#)). The Ría itself—Galicia’s version of a fjord—is a remarkable blend of land, water, and local culture. This makes the *Camino A Orixe* a wonderful way to immerse yourself in this unique corner of coastal Galicia.

This hiking tour offers an unhurried experience of the region’s spectacular landscapes, cuisine, and traditions. The original six stages of the trail have been divided into **eight shorter sections** so you can take your time and enjoy every part of the trek. We stay in **cozy accommodations**, most of them by the sea. **We taste local delicacies** and experience a variety of natural and cultural highlights, including a **boat trip on the Ría** where you will learn about mussel farming—one of the most important livelihoods in the region. Itinerary

This **135 Km** (84 mile) Camino **starts in Corrubedo and ends in Santiago**. I have divided it into **eight stages** so you will walk an **average of 10.5 miles** to walk each day. I have also added a “warmup section” (5 miles) at the beginning of the tour so you can also visit the beautiful area of the **Ría de Noia**, home to **Castro de Baroña**—one of the most important archaeological sites in Galicia.

The **hikes are of low to moderate difficulty**, with a maximum elevation of 300 meters (about 1000 feet). The trail is mainly dirt, with a few sections paved or on asphalt, particularly as you approach Santiago. There are more details about the sites you'll see as you walk each stage of Camino are available via [this link](#).

Walks will always take place in the morning. The distance we walk each day (a maximum of 12.5 miles) can be shortened if the group needs or requests it, or there are unpredictable circumstances such as adverse weather. In the afternoon, there will be optional activities such as visits to local museums, archaeological sites, and parks.

All the meals are included. We will have picnic lunches whenever the weather is suitable, and dinners will be at our accommodation or at a nearby restaurant. Except for the first and last night of the tour, the group will stay **two nights in each accommodation** to reduce time spent checking in and out.

Tour Description

This **brand new tour** takes us through the four main areas of **eastern Andalusia**. I was inspired to design this trip by my experience working in the region from 2009 to 2011, when I was an urban planner overseeing development of the Territorial Masterplan.

Our journey begins in the inland city of **Granada**, the capital of the last Muslim kingdom on the Iberian Peninsula and home to the magnificent **Alhambra Palace**. Over the first two days, we will combine exploring the city and its remarkable history with hikes through its beautiful natural surroundings.

After Granada, we will travel east to the picturesque town of **Guadix**, which will be our base for the next two days. From there, we'll head into the **Sierra de los Filabres** for our hikes. This beautiful mountain range rises above the **Almanzora Valley** to the north and the **Tabernas Desert** to the south. Over the following three days, you will discover why this area became one of the iconic settings for **Spaghetti Western films**.

Our hiking exploration of eastern Andalusia will conclude along the coast. We will spend the final three days in the **Cabo de Gata Natural Park**, an extraordinary semi-arid landscape facing the Mediterranean Sea. It offers a variety of **coastal and inland trails**, **small towns and villages** to explore, and the beauty of **wide natural beaches** and small hidden coves.

We will spend our last afternoon and evening in the city of **Almería**, visiting its stunning **Moorish heritage** and enjoying a farewell dinner at an excellent local restaurant.

We will walk through breathtaking canyons, stand at the foot of soaring cliffs, and look out over vast expanses of eroded rock carved by the silent yet relentless action of water and wind.

Beyond the hikes, there will also be time to explore the **cultural and social dimensions** of this remarkable region. Our stays in Granada and Almería will offer opportunities to explore the region's **Moorish architectural heritage** and how it evolved after the High Middle Ages. The smaller towns along our journey will surprise you with their hidden treasures, and the **traditional cuisine** will certainly be one of the highlights of your trip.

Tour Description

This 12-night hiking tour **begins in Porto and ends in Santiago**. My goal for this tour is to provide the full experience of being a pilgrim on **Portuguese way**—walking the **coastal and inland** trails—but without asking you to walk the less desirable sections, such as those with busy streets. You will also have the option of adding an exciting stretch that forms part of **Spiritual Camino**—a beautiful variant of the Portuguese Camino.

My other objective is to give you the chance to enjoy two countries—Portugal and Spain—through their **geographical, historical and cultural dimensions**. I have selected the sections you will walk with careful attention to the character the landscape (both coastal and inland), the characteristics of the trail itself, and the **sites of historical and cultural interest** along the Camino.

You will stay in cozy accommodations very close to the Camino—most of the time you will be able to walk to them. On two occasions (in Tui, Pontevedra), we will spend two nights at the same place to give you more time to rest and explore the town. Both towns have a great deal of history and beauty for you to discover. Pontevedra is also where you will have your optional rest day.

Finally—and very important to me—the traditional cuisine of these countries will be the highlight of your tour. I have selected menus that feature the best of each culinary tradition. [Explore the photo gallery](#).

Itinerary

The total mileage, including the optional 5-mile hike on the Spiritual Camino, is approximately **110 miles**. I have divided it into 11 sections with an **average of about 10 miles** to walk each day.

To avoid the outskirts of Porto, our Camino will begin in **Póvoa de Varzim**, a vibrant coastal town approximately 20 miles north of the city.

The first four stages of the Camino in Portugal follow the coast. After **Caminha**, we will head inland by walking along the shore of the **Miño River**, which is the border between Portugal and Spain. We will enter Spain by walking across the bridge that connects **Valença do Minho** with **Tui**. The two nights I have scheduled in this area will give you time to visit these two beautiful towns that flank the Miño.

From Tui onward, we will mainly follow the **Central Portuguese Camino**, with two exceptions. The first is the section between **Vigo and Redondela**, which is actually the last stretch of the **Coastal** Camino before it merges with the Central route. The second is on an extra day in **Pontevedra**, when you will have the option to walk *the Camiño da pedra e da auga*—considered the most beautiful part of the **Varainte Espiritual**. It is an alternative route of the Portuguese Camino goes through the hills and connects several important religious sites.

The **hikes are of low to moderate difficulty**, with a maximum elevation of 300 meters (about 1000 feet). The trail is mainly dirt, with a few sections paved or on asphalt, particularly as you approach Santiago.

Walks will always take place in the morning. The distance we walk each day (a maximum of 13 miles) can be shortened if the group needs or requests it, or if there are unpredictable circumstances such as adverse weather. In the afternoons, there will be optional activities such as visits to local museums, archaeological sites, and parks.
